How much wheat and flour in (a) bushels (b) dollar value, did Canada contribute to foreign aid in the past fiscal year?

Hon. Mitchell Sharp (Secretary of State for External Affairs): During the fiscal year 1969/ 70, Canada contributed, through her international development assistance program, the following amounts of wheat and wheat flour: (a) Quantity: Wheat, 748,697 metric tons equivalent to 27,509,373.871 bushels; Wheat Flour, 105,675.112 metric tons equivalent to 5,411,214.6 bushels of wheat based on 72 per cent extraction. (b) Value: Wheat, \$56,950,-
