**Hon. Allan Lawrence (Durham-Northumberland):** Madam Speaker, I ask leave of the House to lay upon the Table a petition, prepared by Mrs. Ruby Burnside of Orono, Ontario, and signed by 934 residents of the town of Newcastle and other places in Durham-Northumberland constituency, concerning the very serious consequences of the recent strike by certain employees of the Post Office. These petitioners are asking that legislation be enacted making it illegal for public servants working in essential services to strike.

Question No. 2,317—**Mr. Munro (Esquimalt-Saanich):**

1. With respect to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police "E" Division headquarters located at 2881 Nanaimo Street in Victoria (a) what was the (i) completion date (ii) cost of construction, including furnishings, office equipment and landscaping (b) on what date was the building opened and occupied by the RCMP?

2. Was a decision made to open a new headquarters in Victoria and, if so, on what basis?

3. Was a decision made to move the headquarters to Vancouver and, if so (a) on what basis (b) on what date will the move occur and what is the itemized cost, including acquisition and preparation of a new building?

**Hon. Bob Kaplan (Solicitor General):** 1. (a) (i) and (ii) Land and adjacent buildings for Division and S-Division headquarters were purchased 78-06-08 for \$4,600,000.
