2. If so, what is the yearly rental of this building?
3. To what use is it being put this winter?
4. Is any revenue being derived from it?
5. What was the cost of maintenance for the twelve months ending December 31, 1937.

*Mr. Lennard*—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. What was the approximate value of the market garden products exported to the United States during the twelve months ending December 31, 1937.

2. What was the value of market garden products imported into Canada from the United States during the same period?
3. What proportion of this amount was imported into Ontario?
4. What was the approximate value of the same production of this produce in Canada during the same period?
5. What proportion of this amount was produced in Ontario?

*Mr. Lennard*—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—How many tons of coal were imported into Canada from Russia during the twelve months ending December 31, 1937?

*Mr. Church*—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Who is Canada's Minister to Japan?

2. What is the cost of the Canadian Legation in Japan for the last fiscal year of record?
3. Has this Legation been functioning during the Sino-Japanese War, and, if so, where?
4. Who is looking after the interests of Canadian Nationals, and who is protecting the interests of Canadian Nationals in the Sino-Japanese War zone?
5. What is Canada's foreign policy in relation to the Sino-Japanese conflict?
6. Will any correspondence or communications with the Chinese or Japanese Governments be laid on the Table in reference to the said conflict or its probable settlement as it effects Canada and Canadian business in the Far East?

*Mr. Church*—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. On what level crossings in Canada was:—(a) the grade crossing fund expended; (b) the special million dollar 1937 vote for that purpose expended?

2. Will the Minister give the House details of expenditures in each case?

*Mr. Church*—On Monday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Did Canada take part in the nine power conferences of the Sino-Japanese war at Brussels?

2. What other countries were represented and who represented Canada?
3. What were the results of said conference?
4. Did the conference propose to stop the victorious Japanese advance? Did it propose to end the war, and, if so, how?
5. Who was responsible for the utter failure of this important conference?
6. Will a report of the conference be tabled?
7. What technique of diplomacy does Canada employ at these conferences?
8. Did Canada separately or with Great Britain ask the United States to join them in a note of protest to Japan?
9. Did the United States reply that they would act separately and not jointly?
