NOTICES OF MOTIONS.

For Thursday, 11th February, 1875.

By the Honorable Mr. *Campbell* :—

Feb'y. 8—That an humble address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House copies of the Postal Convention recently made with the Postmaster General of the *United States* by the Postmaster General of *Canada*.

Inquiry by the Honorable Mr. *Alexander* :—

- “ 8—Whether the Government are prepared to put into immediate operation the Act passed during the last session, for the prevention of the adulteration of Food and Drink; and whether any appointments have been made since the Act came into operation on the 1st January last?
- “ 8—Whether arrangements have been made, or will be made, with the Food Analysts appointed under the Act, so that their services may be available to the public on payment of a small fee, as in similar Acts in *Great Britain*, so that information may be obtained by private individuals with regard to the quality of food offered for sale, or already sold, to aid the proper officers in carrying out prosecutions?
