"is it your pleasure to dispense with the "reading at length of His Excellency's "Speech?" and sitting down, sends the copy to the Clerk. The Clerk beginning also to read it, is interrupted in the same way, and sits down. M. 172; B. 85.

Day appointed for consideration of Speech. 21. The Leader of the House now moves: "That the Speech be taken into consideration "on....;" and the Speaker says: "It is "moved, Honourable Senators, by the "Honourable...., seconded by...., That "(reading the motion). Those who are in "favour of the motion will say 'Content;' "those who are against it will say 'Not "Content.' The Contents have it." R. 6; B. 85.

CONSIDERATION OF SPEECH FROM THRONE

Address in reply to Speech.

22. When the Order of the Day for the consideration of the Speech is called, and the mover and seconder having enlarged on the Speech, the motion for the Address in reply is proposed, the Speaker says: "Honourable "Senators, it is moved by the Honourable "...., seconded by the Honourable...., "That, &c."
