unfairness to some students for the advantage of others, and that in return you will see that nothing further is said of errors which you declare you knew to exist, is, in my epinion, a most improper proposal, and one which the University cannot possibly consider. I may say that when I first read the telegram I thought of writing to the Honourable the Premier and protesting against such a telegram being sent out from an officer of a Government Department to an institution like McGill University. I have not done so, because I think your better judgment will tell you that such a telegram should not have been sont by you.

When we had our interview, I gave you the assurance that the University would always andeavour to work in harmony with the Department, but that involves obligations on the part of both of us.
