to preach the truth, and nothing but the truthif they are to be saved from shallow conceits and questions which gender strife,—if the old gospel is to swell grandly from lips that are strong to speak it,—if, in fine, this longing world shall ever see a Babel reversed by a Pentecost, it will be when the feeblest intercessor shall be even as David, and David as an angel of the Lord, and from each heart and lip of the sacramental host shall swell the bold resolve, "For Zion's sake I will not hold my peace, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until the rightcousness thereof go forth as brightness, and the salvation thereof as a lamp that burneth."

Dear brethren, suffer, I pray you, the word of exhortation in these matters, which bear largely upon the welfare of the Church. There is a remarkable passage in one of the epistles of the beloved disciple to which I should like, in closing, to refer you, —" Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward" (2 John, verse 8). Is not the mysterious truth here indicated, that in some way or other—how and wherefore we know not—there is

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
