Canadian Pacific Railway Has Plans Prepared For Work During All of Next Year.

COMPETITION IS FEARED

Tremendous Increase in Grain Trade Also Makes Double-Tracking an Absolute Necessity.

The Canadian Pacific Railway are to make their transcontinental line between Fort William, Ont., and Brandon, Man., a four track line. It was officially stated to The World yesterday that the C.P.R. now have plans under way to make this section of the transcontinental a four track road and that bor sufficient for such an undertaking can be got together, we will start the work," was the statement made. The necessity of the C.P.R. making

their, line a four track road is due to the tremendous increase in Canada's grain output, and also due in a measure to the competition which they will face from the Grand Trunk Pacific and the Canadian Northern Trans-continental. The C.P.R. line between Fort William and Brandon, a distance of more than 550 miles, has already been double tracked. West of Brandon the C.P.R. have adopted a method which will prevent the great length of time required which would be the result of double tracking the line, and have adopted the plan of double tracking a distance of ten miles out from each of the terminal points. The work of doing this is now under way and will in a great measure remove the loss of time occasioned by having only the single track. It is, however, to be followed by the double tracking of the line from Brandon thru to the coast. The C.P.R. have also under way the project of double tracking the line between Toronto and Montreal. This is awaiting the completion of the lake shore portion of the new C.P.R. line being built thru Eastern Ontario, which will be finished this year. With the completion of the double track line from Toronto east, the C.P.R. will next face the task of double tracking the line from Toronto to Windsor.
