## RED DONAHUE CASHES IN

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 25.—Frank L. "Red" Donahue, star pitcher a dozen years ago, died at his home here today after a long illness. He was 71 years of age. He retired from baseball seven years ago and entered business. Donahue entered professional ball in 1892, when he played with the Milford, Conn. team. Later he played on the Lowell club of the New England League and with the Allentown, Pa. team. He signed with the St. Louis club of the National League in 1896, and the following year he was with the Philadelphia Nationals, with whom he remained until 1902, when he entered the American League, playing successfully with St. Louis, Cleveland and Detroit. Donahue, while with the Philadelphia Nationals, pitched a no-hit game against Boston.
