BRISK CATTLE TRADE
AT HIGHER PRICES

Quotations Rose Fifteen to Twenty Cents at Union Stock Yards.

COMPLAIN OF QUALITY
Hog Values Steady With Limited Receipts—Veal Calves Wanted.

Receipts of live stock yesterday (Tuesday) were 67 cars, comprising 1070 cattle, 588 hogs, 854 sheep and lambs and 239 calves.

The quality of fat cattle offered was far from being what the demand called for, nor were the numbers equal to the demand.

Trade was active, and prices 15c to 20c higher, when the quality of the offerings was considered.

Stocks and feeders were in demand at firm prices, as feed has become plentiful.

Milk and milkers were few in number, but prices were about steady. There were two good enough in quality to sell for \$100 each.

Veal calves of choice quality were in demand, and several sold at \$11 per cwt. Sheep sold at steady to firm prices.

While lambs brought a little higher values. Hogs sold at steady prices, although receipts were light.

Butcher's Cattle. Loads of choice, heavy steers are worth \$8.50 to \$9, and one buyer stated that he would pay \$9.50 for the right kind.

NEW YORK BANKERS MORE OPTIMISTIC

Success of Recent Negotiations With London is Inspiring Confidence.

NEW YORK, Sept. 8.—More confidence in the financial situation was expressed by domestic bankers today. This feeling was regarded as a natural reflection of the easier conditions reported from London, resulting largely from the success which attended recent negotiations for the payment of New York City's indebtedness.

Direct connection with Paris was more difficult today, but bankers with French connections were completing arrangements for drawing bills on Bordeaux, the temporary seat of the French Government. It was said heavy remittances to that point would be made in the near future.

Foreign exchange was slightly easier, rates for cables and demand on London declining about 1½ per cent, but advancing a trifle later in the day. Transfer of \$1,000,000 gold to Canada was made by the local agent of a Canadian bank who declined to disclose the character of the transaction. There is reason to believe that shipments of gold metal from this and other home reserve centres to Ottawa for account of maturing obligations will be made in the near future.

Local money conditions were unchanged as to rates, but supply was more liberal, the market being more active. The government's cotton report issued today places the amount of that staple ginned from the 1914 crop to Sept. 1 at a little more than 475,000 bales, or substantially 235,000 less than in the corresponding period of 1913.

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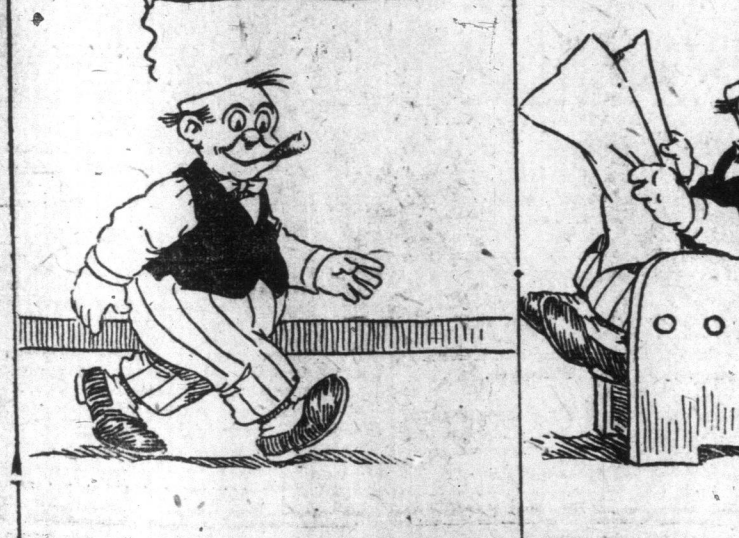

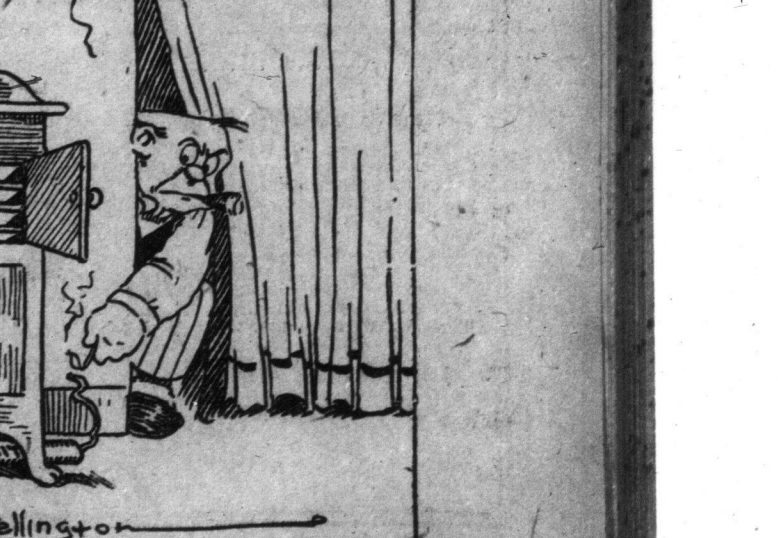
