ARTICLES REQUIRED FOR UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL

Articles required by the Toronto Women's Patriotic League for the University of Toronto Hospital: Gray flannel shirts, no collar, buttonhole and button on band; sew button on very tightly; size of collar not less than 16. Butterick pattern No. 7006.

Dressing gowns, dark colors, flannel or elderdown. Butterick pattern No. 3865. Sieeping suits. Butterick pattern No. 180.

Hospital night shirts flanding Hospital night shirts, flannelette or

cotton, sack pattern. Butterick No. 133. Open down the back, tied in two places with tapes.
Socks, preferably gray, heavy, very smooth round heels.
Pillows, 16x24 inches. Pillow slips, 18x26 inches. Cheap quality. Wash cloths. Turkish toweling, one yard long. Cheesecloth handkerchiefs, washed and ironed, but not hemmed, cut, nor torn.

Surgical dressings, bandages, 2, 2½ and 3 inches wide, 5 yards long, of medium weight factory cotton, rolled on bandage roller and fastened with one or two safety pins.

All other surgical supplies should be made under the direction of a trained nurse or practising physician.

YNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a namily, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Fanitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Dutles—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre.

Dutles—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A setfler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Dutles—Must reside six months in each of the three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
