FIFTEEN THOUSAND AT MARKHAM FAIR

Entry List in All Classes of Live Stock Showed Big Increase.

SO MANY MOTOR CARS

All records in point of attendance at the Markham Fair were broken yesterday when 15,000 people entered the gates, while the entry list in all classes of live stock and practically every other class from every part of the county, while the adjoining city swelled the attendance by thousands.

A feature of the Markham Fair this year was the number of motor cars on the grounds and streets of the town, estimates varying from 800 to 1,000.
