and killed fifteen Perfons, including Women and Children; wounded feven, three of whom died in the Hospital; fix Men were carried away, and never heard of fince. The Party quartered there, being alarmed by the Noife in the Morning, were instantly drawn up by Lieutenant Clark, of Colonel Warburton's Regiment, who commanded there; they marched in hafte to the Indians, who discharged some Shot, killed a Serjeant dead upon the Spot, and wounded the fuperior Officer in the Leg; the former being very brave, run before the others. where he was attacked, and got feveral Wounds; his right Hand was cut off, and the Thumband Ring-finger of his Left-Hand ; he was miferably mangled by their Hangers and Knives; three Soldiers were wounded.

The Indians, after difcharging one Volley run off with Precipitation, not waiting the Arrival of our Troops, and giving them an Opportunity of firing when juft at their Breafts with the Muzzle of their Guns, as the Commandant vainly imagined : They were not purfued for fear an Ambush, as the Officer gave out; tho' I am apt to me ed fps bei gin ma but not fte ing of rut for Gr lar MPa qu pli
