Or to make their Words and Actions correspond with each other? More particularly when we farther recollect, that till these Offers were made, They had discours'd of an Accomodation with Spain as the most favourable Event which could befall us; as an Event which would have reconciled all Parties to a vigorous Profecution of the War with France; and which would have induced them to part with the last Shilling in Support of it.

But, the Truth of the Matter is, That mutable and inconfiftent as they appear'd, they adher'd, in the Main, to the grand Principles of their Plan, and the Ends it was to answer: For the foster our Fall had prov'd, after so violent and ill-directed a Carier, the less obnoxious would that M----r have been held, who first put us in Motion.

It was, neverthelefs, neceffary, to find out fome Colour to fet on this Inconfiftency and Mutability, which was fo glaring, that the Public began not only to take Notice of it, but even to clamour againft it; and the *Blind* they chofe to fpread for this righteous Purpofe, was a pretended Difference of Opinion; as to the great Perfuits of War and Peace; and a pretended Quarrel, which was faid to have grown out of this Difference of Opinion, and the Debates it had given Rife to.
