PRINTING HAS BEEN PERFORMED, to arrive at the exact amount paid or the Province for that purpose; but that the sum is very large, and has not varied to any great extent since 1867 in the prices charged.

Your Committee wish to call attention to the fact that thus far in their researches they find \$25,682.50 has been paid out the last year for this service, yet the Financial Returns laid upon the table of the House show only a cost of Six Thousand Four Hundred and Sixteen Dollars

This is the most specific and crushing conviction of swindling and robbery ever recorded against any body of men. not only exposes and condemns the whole system, giving the names of the swindlers, but gives particular acts ot dishonesty, showing who committed them, and the amount of dishonest gains bagged in each case by the offending parties. Here, in the first seven items, Messrs. Lastly, the charges have never been attempted to be denied even by the parties themselves.

It will be noticed, however, that the committee were "unable, owing to the pernicious system," to discover the full amount that Messrs. Annand, Vail, and Blackadar had bled the Province. They found, however, that in 1874, although the public returns only showed \$6,416 as paid for public printing, that Messrs Annand, Vail and Blackadar had acs tually received during that year no les than \$26,58211 It is a quite reason able supposition that, considering the departments from which they were unable to obtain any or full reports, that there could not have been less than \$30,000 bagged by these men during that

one year.

The average of overcharge is shown to be at least 200 per cent., which would make their dishouest gains TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS PER ANNUM!!
