

He laments that he cannot give as favourable an account of the state of Religion in the neighbouring Parishes, particularly in those between Frederickton and Woodstock. Their zeal for Religion and their wish to have a Clergyman of the Established Church among them have not abated; but their means, notwithstanding their utmost exertions, are not adequate to so desirable an end.—His Notitia for the year ending June 24, 1809, stands thus: Baptisms 29; Marriages 15; Burials 14. Communicants 50.

The Rev. Mr. Scovil, Missionary at Kingston, returns thanks to the Society for his appointment to that Mission in the room of his late father. He continues to officiate as formerly at Springfield and Hampton. His Parish encreases, and the Congregation has been in general more numerous than formerly. The Communicants also encrease. They now amount to 139 in the Parish of Kingston only—in Hampton 30—in Springfield 28. In the last half year, he baptized 21 Infants; married 10 couple; and buried 3.
