He laments that he cannot give as favourable an account of the ftate of Religion in the neighbouring Parifhes, particularly in those between Fredericton and Woodftock. Their zeal for Religion and their wish to have a Clergyman of the Established Church among them have not abated; but their means, notwithstanding their utmost exertions, are not adequate to so defirable an end.—His Notitia for the year ending June 24, 1809, stands thus: Baptisms 29; Marriages 15; Burials 14. Communicants 50.

The Rev. Mr. Scovil, Miffionary at Kingfton, returns thanks to the Society for his appointment to that Miffion in the room of his late father. He continues to officiate as formerly at Springfield and Hampton. His Parifh encreafes, and the Congregation has been in general more numerous than formerly. The Communicants alfo encreafe. They now amount to 139 in the Parifh of Kingfton only—in Hampton 30—in Springfield 28. In the laft half year, he baptized 21 Infants; married 10 couple; and buried 3.

The Rev. Mr. Clarke, Miffionary at Gage Town, has the pleafure to inform the Society, that the Church is in a flourishing state, and the people are more attentive to religious duties than heretofore. Since the 30th of F January,
