

INVESTIGATE YORK LOAN 1000 SHAREHOLDERS SAY SO

Hamilton Investors Hold Lively Meeting and Will Demand Government Inquiry Into Company.

Hamilton, Dec. 8.—(Special.)—There was a big mass meeting of the share-holders of the York County Loan and Savings Co. in Association Hall this evening. Over 1000 attended. They unanimously decided to demand a government investigation, or the management investigation, or the management. erament investigation or the management of the company. They were advised to do so by Mayor Biggar, who said that Hon. W. J. Hanna and Hon. J. S. Hendrie had both promised to help secure such an investigation.
Both the mayor and H. Carpenter
denounced the management. They
said the directors had either been imsaid the directors had either been improvident or had violated their charter. They charged that the company had made investments that it had no right to make. Mr. Carpenter said that it had been represented to him that the company had represented itself as carrying on a savings bank business. Both he and the mayor considered that the proposed amalgamation was not in the interests of the shareholders, who would not be able to get more than 80 cents on the dollar, and perhaps not more than 50 cents, and would have to wait nine years for their money. wait nine years for their money.

The shareholders made Ald. Gilbert their proxy, and will cancel the proxies signed in favor of Manager Fnillips. It is estimated that some \$100,000 of the savings of Hamilton workingment in the company. is sunk in the company.
