

All Canada owes a debt of gratitude to the Women's Wentworth Historical Society, for it is the only society in the Dominion, patriotic, historical or fraternal, which has secured and holds any historic ground. It owns the site of the battle of Stony Creek, the only battleground which can be preserved for future generations. The society was organized in the spring of 1895, der the name of the ladies' committee Mrs. Sanford resigned her office after and Mrs. John Calder was elected president, which office she still holds. Mrs. Sanford was made honorary president. In November, 1895, the society gave a grand historical entertainment for a week in the armory, and besides local exhibits, loans were sent from Lundy's Lane Historical Society, also from Toronto, Brantford and other cities. It was probably the best exhibition of Canadian historical relics ever given. Over \$1100 was realized from it.

In the summer of 1895 Mrs. Calder learned that the old Gage, homestead and four and one-half acres of land surrounding it. which formed the centre of operations on the important night of June 6, 1813, was about to be sold. She at once secured it, becoming perand Mrs. John Calder was elected pre-


