DEFENDANT SPOKE TO JURYMEN JUDGE HEARD EVIDENCE HIMSELF

Michael Curran Awarded \$200 Damages From William Thoman for Seduction—He Asked for \$5000—St. George's Society Elects Life Members—Post's Shareholders Meet.

Hamilton, Oct. 16.—The quarterly meeting of the St. George's Society was held this evening in the Board of Trade rooms.

There was a mile in session at the Assize Court this morning in connection with the suit of Morris v. Barnes.

Justice Falconbridge asked Mr. Carcellian what he had to say in answer.

His Lordship then said there was quite sufficient ground for not having the case tried by the jury.

Mr. Carcellian renewed his objections to the jury note being struck out.
