If Mr. Durman and I contributed anything, it was very little. It was his skill that brought the Diamond Sculls to Toronto."

Ed. Durman simply acknowledged his thanks for the kindly mention of his name.

Honor for All.

E. F. Clarke, M.P., said that all were united in extending to the young champion a hearty welcome, and offering him cordial congratulations. The gentlemen who had last addressed the gathering had taken little credit to themselves, but he ventured to say that Mr. Scholes owed a great deal to their attentions during the great strain he underwent, and perhaps it had not been the son of his father he would never have done it.
