



Sisters Drowned While Bathing in River on Father's

LONDON, July 24.—(By the Associated Press.)—Eight hundred natives were killed and 1,600 wounded during the recent disturbances in Egypt, according to dispatches from Gen. Allenby, Cecil Harmsworth, under-secretary of the foreign office, made this announcement in the House of Commons tonight.
