

WHERE KLUCK STOPPED.

Senlis, France, Dec. 9.—In the hamlet of Senlis, a few kilometers south of Paris, on the road to Paris, an obelisk some twelve feet high, surmounted by the statue of a French soldier has just been unveiled. It marks the exact spot where, on September 7, 1914, the advance guard of the armies of von Kluck was brought to a halt a little less than fifteen miles from Paris.

8,000,000 BRITISH WORKERS INSURED UNDER NEW ACT

Measure Provides Compulsory Insurance Against Unemployment.

LONDON, Dec. 9.—Eight millions of British workers become automatically insured against unemployment under the new act which came into operation today. This new act extends compulsory insurance against unemployment to practically all persons in receipt of remuneration not exceeding £260 a year. After a "waiting period" of three days of unemployment, beneficiaries become entitled to 15 shillings per week for men, 12 shillings for women, 7s 6d for boys under 18, and 6 shillings for girls under 18 years.

LONDON, Dec. 9.—Scarcity of houses in the East Ham district has led the local branch of the national union of ex-service men to take "direct action" in regard to empty houses which are marked "to be sold."

THREATEN TROUBLE OVER OCCUPANT FOR THRONE OF HUNGARY

Finding King Proves Constant Source of Unrest.

SOME WANT CHARLES

Independent Magyars Declare They Will Never Permit It.

BUDAPEST, Dec. 9.—The question who will eventually occupy the throne of Hungary, has been a constant source of unrest and trouble, threatening a sudden upheaval of the recently-attained peace and order.

The pro-Hapsburgs declare that the former Emperor Charles is the real king of Hungary, and that no one else can legally aspire to the throne until he abdicates. The Independent Magyars, including large masses of the rural population, declare they will never surrender their recently-won independence.

In addition, there is a third group of politicians which is willing to offer the throne to any king who promises the restoration of Hungary's lost provinces. To achieve this, they would even consent to do homage to the king of the Serbs or the Rumanians.

Much propaganda is being circulated in favor of the former Emperor Charles or his eldest son, Prince Otto, and grave fears are expressed that the over-zealous partisans of the Hapsburg dynasty may eventually succeed in compelling the country to accept a royalist coup as an accomplished fact. There is every indication that the followers of Charles are successful in their efforts to convince the country that the restoration of the Hapsburgs would improve Hungary's lamentable situation.

VALUABLES FOUND BY DIGGERS IN SEWER

Boston, Mass., Dec. 9.—A sewer gang quit work at noon recently with a valued treasure trove. In the slime of an old pit near the Quincy House they had found three gold rings, coins, watches and other valuables. Hotel employees suggested that the hotel had a claim on the articles as the property probably belonged to guests of bygone days. The police suspected that they were part of the loot of thieves, but when the men showed the coins dating back to 1787, stamped with a pine tree on one side and "Massachusetts" on the other, they insisted that the statute of limitations made the property theirs.

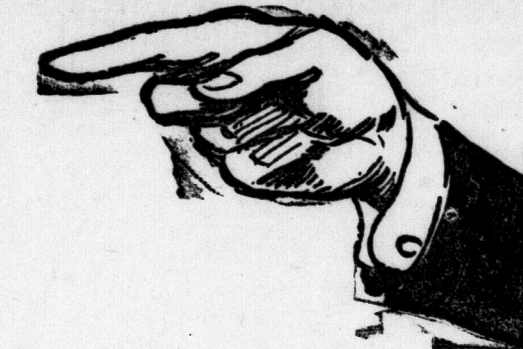
BOLSHEVIKI EXPERTS RESORT TO WAR-TIME METHODS OF PRINTING
