BEDFORD NOT HIS NAME

Confessed Murderer of Ethel Knrade is Visited by His Brother-in-Law.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—(C. A. P.)—The correct name of Edward William Bedford, the man who confesses to murdering Ethel Knrade in Hamilton, is John Corry. He was born in London. His brother-in-law called at Brixton Prison to-day. Bedford was committed to the cell when he arrived in this country, and had considerable money. He did not look like a man who had worked his passage over. His brother-in-law did not believe that Bedford committed the crime that he confesses to. There is no insanity in the family. Bedford would not tell his brother-in-law's name or that of the steamer he came over on. Bedford was four years in Canada, but when writing relations in this country, he always gave the same postoffice as his address.

BOYS PLAYED WITH SWITCH

And the Soo Express Was Derailed—No One Hurt.

NORTH BAY, Oct. 20.—A switch interlocked with, probably by boys, at the west end of the C. P. R. yards here derailed the Soo eastbound express last night. Fortunately no one was seriously injured. The express messenger, W. E. Blake of Kingston, was hit by broken glass. The express and baggage car plunged down the embankment to the lake shore, turning over, the engine and other cars staying on the tracks.

Martin J. Down's Estate.

A fortune of about \$200,000 was left by Martin J. Down, owner of Cole Bros. circus, who died in the General Hospital on Tuesday. The estate is now being administered by Corry, Pa., is valued at \$200,000, and it is understood that the deceased also left \$50,000 in the bank, as well as considerable Toronto real estate. Mr. Down was also heavily insured in the Mutual Life Assurance Co.

Phone Girl Saw Burglar.

CORNWALL, Oct. 20.—When Miss Whiteside of the Bell Telephone Co.'s local staff went into the girls' cloak room at 11:30 p.m. a burglar was climbing out of the window. She screamed, but the thief got away with a purse containing \$5. Several local stores have been broken into of late.

Toronto Live Stock.

There were 74 carloads of live stock at the City Market. The quality of cattle and hogs, both butchers and feeders, was common to medium, with few exceptions. Prices in all the different classes were unchanged.

Union Stock Yards.

Receipts were three double-decks, of 600 sheep and lambs, with one load of cattle. One load of butchers sold at \$4.80; 400 sheep and lambs sold readily at \$5.50 to \$5.80 for lambs, and \$5.20 for the sheep.

Southwestern Traction Co. Changes Hands.

LONDON, Ont., Oct. 20.—The Southwestern Traction Company, running between London and Lake Erie, at Port Stanley, was sold by auction this afternoon to J. E. McDougall, London, representing a syndicate of London, Toronto and Hamilton capitalists. He paid \$60,000 in cash and assumed \$30,000 indebtedness. The total price being \$90,000 above the reserve. J. E. McDougall, the highest bidder, running it up to \$40,000 and \$50,000 debt. Mr. Gilles represented the bondholders. The London Street Railway Company, of which H. A. Everett, Cleveland, is president, had a cheque in for \$350,000.

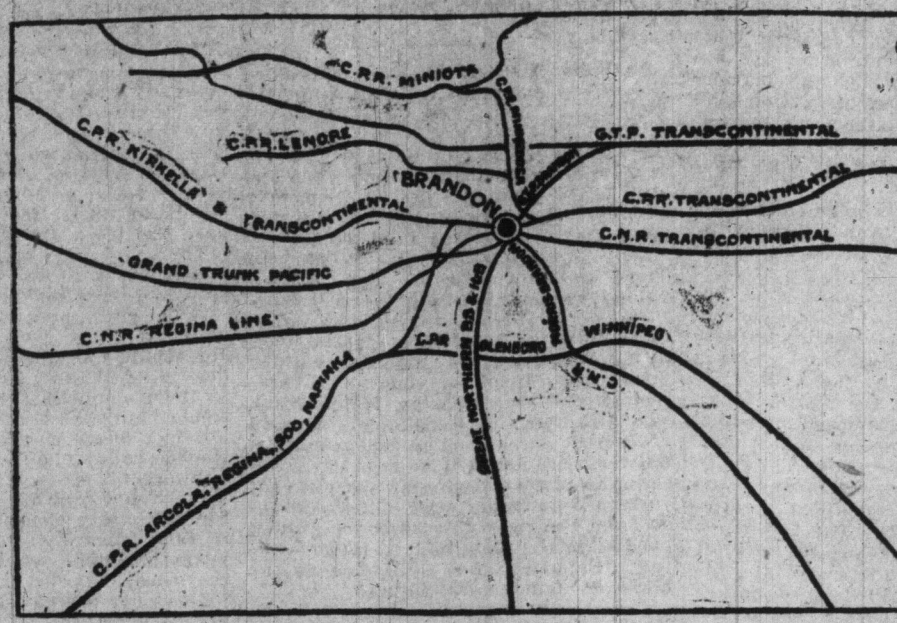
