WHOLESALE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Receipts were heavy and prices easier on the bulk of the offerings yesterday. Strawberries—Some of the berries were very good quality in the market, low as 12 1/2c per box, the bulk going at 15c to 22c, with an odd extra choice bringing 25c, but the market yesterday did not warrant the 25c.

Raspberries came in much more freely and declined in price. They were of a wide range, as the quality varied from the largest and most complete in stock, selling all the way from 25c to 40c per box, only the largest and most complete in stock of slightly used or new parts.

Blueberries were cheaper, selling at \$2.50 to \$3.50 per 11-quart basket. Beans were quite plentiful and went downward in price, a few bringing \$1.50 per 11-quart in the morning, but \$1 was hard to get for same quality in the afternoon, some closing at 75c per 11-quart.

Currents—Red currents declined in price, as quoted below. Stronach & Sons had strawberries selling at 17c to 20c per box; raspberries at 30c to 35c per box; red currents at 12c to 15c per box, and 75c to 1 1/2c per six-quart; gooseberries at 10c to 15c per box; blueberries at \$2.50 to \$3.50 per 11-quart; black currants at \$3 per 11-quart; cherries at 75c to 85c per six-quart, and \$1 to 1.50 per 11-quart; sweet peas at 75c to 1 1/2c per 11-quart; peas at 75c to 1 1/2c per 11-quart; rhubarb at 30c to 35c per dozen; cabbage at 17c to 20c per bushel.
