—(8 p.m.)—The disturbance which was
over New Jersey last night now covers
northern Maine, with greatly reduced
energy. Pressure is very low over the
western portion of the continent and
highest in the Gulf states. Snow and
rain have occurred today over the pen-
insula of Ontario and rain from the Ot-
tawa valley to the Gulf of St. Law-
rence. From Lake Superior westward
the weather has been very fine and con-
tinued warm in Alberta and Saskatche-
wan.
