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EDUCATION DEPARTMENT IS PROMISED BOOK PAPER

Port Arthur, Ont., Jan. 3.—The contract between the Ontario government and the Provincial Paper Mills, Limited, whereby the company gets a pulp limit of 1200 square miles and agrees to erect a paper mill in Port Arthur, includes a clause to the effect that the mill will supply all the book paper wanted by the Ontario Department of Education for a period of 21 years.

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FOUGHT FOR TWO DAYS TO KEEP VESSEL AFLOAT

New York, Jan. 3.—The Portuguese schooner Ouzitz, which sailed Dec. 29 from Norfolk for Oporto with a cargo of coal, sprang a leak and was abandoned yesterday 200 miles off Cape Hatteras.

The captain and the 12 men of his crew were taken off the ship early yesterday morning by the steamship Vauban and brought to this port today.
