Piccadilly House Brings \$7500 for Coronation Day

Two Hundred Guineas Asked For One Window Along Route of

LONDON, June 3.-Remarkably big prices are being asked and readily obtained in the west end for seats to view the Coronation procession.

In Piccadilly, the agreed price for the use of a house, having accommodation for a large party on June 23, is 1500 guineas, (about \$7500).

Not far away 1200 guineas, (\$6000) is being demanded for the use of a house for both days. Almost equally high prices are being obtained for accommodation in St. James-street. A commodation in St. James-street. A conservatory is to be had for 1000 guineas, (\$5000) and probably many people will be eager to secure it.

The occupiers of flats in good positions along the route are reaping a harvest readily obtaining 300 to 400 guineas for three or four windows.

The fine view of the procession obtainable from Trafalgar Square is leading to numerous inquiries for seats there. Two hundred guineas are being asked for one window. Many others have already let at sums near that figure.






