

FAMOUS GEMS OF PROSE

From a speech on Texas independence in the U. S. genate, July 1, 1836.

UNHAPPY day, that Palm Sunday, March 27, when the 512 prisoners at Goliad, issuing from the sally port at dawn of day, one by one, under the cruel delusion of a return to their families, found themselves enveloped in double files of cavalry and infantry, marched to a spot fit for the perpetration of a horrid deed—and there, without an instant to think of parents, country, friends and God—in the midst of the consternation of terror and surprise, were inhumanly set upon and pitlessly put to death in spite of those moving cries which reached to heaven, and regardless of those supplicating hands stretched forth for mercy, from which arms had been taken under the perfidious forms of a capitulation.

Five hundred and six perished that morning—young, vigorons, brave, sons of respectable families, and the pride of many a parent's heart—and their bleeding bodies torn with wounds, and many yet alive were thrown in heaps upon vast fires for the flames to consume what the steel had mangled. Six only escaped, and not by mercy, but by miracles. And this was the work of man upon his brother; of Christian upon Christian; of those upon those who adore the same God, invoke the same heavenly benediction, and draw precepts of charity and mercy from the same divine fountain.


