A DIRECT appeal to Premier Poincaré to repeal, or at least amend, the degree eliminating sports and athletics from the French army has met with prompt response. Both as president of the republic and premier he promised to do all that he could to aid in the development of sport.

PRESIDENT BOYD, of the Canadian Basketball Association, has appointed Miss Alex. Gibb, of Toronto, as representative of the Association to the annual meeting of the Women's Athletic Federation of Canada, which will be held in Montreal on December 7.

SUPPORT of K. M. Landis for reelection as baseball commissioner by a majority of American League club-owners hinges upon revision of his agreement with the two major circuits, according to Col. Jacob Ruppert, president of the New York Yankees.

RALPH GREENLEAF, holder of the world's pocket billiard championship, has been forced to remain idle recently due to an injured right hand. Greenleaf said that his injury was sustained in an automobile accident in Philadelphia last Saturday night. The joint on the second finger of his right hand was badly swollen, but he hopes to resume his stage work next week.

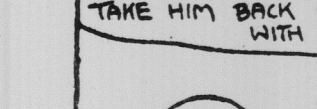

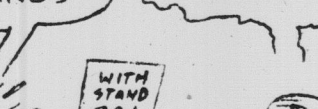
