Agreement Provides For Annuity of \$40,000,000 for Five Years

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1—The frail formula of a tentative arrangement which must be ratified by the French government today was thrust into the breach to prevent complete collapse of the Franco-United States debt

the Franco-United States debt funding negotiations.

Thus, one week after Finance Minister Caillaux and his associates had laid down the first French proposal for funding their government's four-billion-dollar war debt, they departed for Paris, taking with them a document intended only to fill the gap sufficiently to assure continuity of negotiations—even at long range. The arrangement, proposed by the United States Debt Commission as a final move to overcome what appeared to be insurmountable difficulties, would have France pay an annuity of forty million dollars a year for five years, and would enable the two governments to continue consideration of a program of final settlement to succeed the proposed temporary pact at its expiration.
