To Consecrate 2 Japanese Bishops

Will Be First Native Prelates of Any Christian Church in Orient.

New York, Aug. 6.—Consecration of two Japanese as bishops of the Episcopal Church at Tokio and Osaka next December will mark the establishment for the first time of a Christian church resided over by natives in the Orient.

R. P. & W. F. STARR presided over by natives, in the Orient, it was announced at the Epicopal Church mission house.

Bishop Thomas F. Gailor of Tennes-

see, president of the national council of the Epicopal Church, will sail from Seattle for Tokio Nov. 22, to take part in the ceremonies, which are to be held Dec. 9 and 11. The Rev. J. S. Motoda and the Rev. Yusutaro Naide will be

consecrated bishops of Tokio and Osaka, respectively.

An international aspect will be given to the event by the presence of Epicopal and Anglican bishops from various parts of the world. In addition to Bishop Gailor, who will represent the presiding bishop of the American Church, a representative of the Archbishop of Canterbury is expected from the Church of England. The Rt. Rev. Mark A. Trollope, Anglican bishop of Korea and one of the bishops of the church in China will also be present.
