BLINDED SOLDIER WINS HIS FIGHT

Fine Example of Pluck and Perseverance in Overcoming Handicap.

Ottawa, July 15—(Canadian Press)—James H. Rawlinson, ex-Canadian soldier, blinded in action, has just left Ottawa on the first part of his journey to London, Eng., where he is to assume the duties of clerk stenographer in the London office of the department of immigration and colonization.

During the last two and a half years Rawlinson, who was trained at St. Dunstan's school in England, was one of the most efficient and accurate stenographers on the staff of the department of soldiers' civil re-establishment in Toronto. He spent sixteen months in learning the Braille system of shorthand and the use of the typewriter. Despite his handicap, he passed the stenographic examination with a score of 80.3 per cent and obtained a percentage of 80.3 on the test. He is the first blind applicant known to have been tried and passed a civil service test.

IMPERIAL OIL OFFICIAL DEAD; SHOT HIMSELF

Port McMurray, Alta., July 15—(Chas. E. Taylor of Edmonton, an official of the Imperial Oil Company, shot himself on Wednesday while en route to this city on the steamer McMurray. No details given.

Taylor was one of Edmonton's best known figures. Years ago he was struck by a train and before joining the Imperial Oil Company was manager of the Alliance Power Company. A court of enquiry held on board the steamer rendered a verdict that Taylor died of a self-inflicted wound.

USE OF COMPRESSED GAS REPORTS IN CANADA According to a report issued from the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, 47 were fourteen establishments producing compressed gas in Canada in 1918. The industry has developed into one of considerable commercial importance, as represents a capital investment in plant and equipment of nearly \$2,000,000. It is said that 36,000,000 cubic feet of gas was produced during the year, and that more than 5,000,000 cubic feet of acetylene was also made. These gases are principally used in oxy-acetylene welding and the great volume of gas produced is indicative of the extent to which this comparatively new method of repairing and cutting iron and steel has developed. Nearly 6,000,000 feet of carbon dioxide was made, for use in the manufacture of soft drinks and the soda water so extensively used in the preparation of refreshing beverages sold in the ice cream parlors.

A point about the manufacture of oxygen is that since it is made by the liquid air process, nearly four times as much nitrogen must have been produced and thrown away. No use has been found for this latter gas up to the present, and as a consequence there is a sale for it in the open market. The gas is quoted at an average of \$19.90 a thousand cubic feet, compressed acetylene at \$25.30, and carbon dioxide at \$80.50.

BIGOTRY VANISHING. (Argonaut) Bishop Brown said at a dinner in Richmond: "Bigotry and religious intolerance are vanishing from off the earth.
