"It has been my desire to see this picture produced for the same reason that I wrote the book," said Mr. Gerard, "because I have wanted to bring home to our people the gravity of the situation, and for that reason I watched it carefully during its production so that it presents a clear picture to the mind of every American of what America faced in German autocracy."

No film yet shown at the Imperial seems to have had the power and gripping truthfulness of the Gerard narrative. Last night's throngs sat spellbound, as it were, only to burst forth into tumultuous applause as the British and American diplomats, second point upon point against their thick-headed and unscrupulous rivals.

"My Four Years in Germany" is booked for today and tomorrow and should be seen by everybody. It is truly the historical education in diplomatic matters in view of the approaching peace negotiations. The Keith people are to be commended for importing such a worthy film in these days of so much silly stuff.

The sum of \$25 had been sent to Nursing Sister Owen Haley, \$22.50 had been spent on soldiers' teas and \$18 on missions. During the winter 1918 articles had been made for the Red Cross and fifty pairs of socks for the Soldiers' Comforts Association.
