

SALE OF REFJRMED

After a long struggle against adverse circumstances and with their numbers de-pleted by the loss of their members through death and removal, the members of the congregation of the Reformed Presbyterian church have decided that they can no longer support the church buildings on their present scale. At a meeting of the congregation this week they decided to affer their property for sale, and, when the sale is made, to start again in a smaller way. The church was once strong and pros-perous, but for years it has been diminish-ing in strength partly because there are few other churches of their denomination in this section from which to draw mem-bers to take the place of those who leave and partly from their refusal to comprom-ise with their ideals and to depart from their own methods. The church is con-ducted according to the ideas of the cov-emanters and modern methods are frowned upon. There is no organ in the church, and the Psalms of David are the only music tolerated within the walls of the church. They have sternly refused to mix what they look upon as entertainment with their worship and have clung to their old fashioned ideals.
