# WHITE SLAVE RAIDS MADE BY THE POLICE

Simultaneous Arrests in New York and Hartford Regarded as Meaning Important Captures

New York, Oct. 12.—What are regarded by agents of the department of justice as the most important arrests made in the government's war against the white slave trade occurred simultaneously on Saturday in this city and Hartford, Conn. A man and woman, who are alleged to have made a business of supplying girls for immoral purposes to houses in neighboring cities for years, were locked up here, while the woman proprietor of a disorderly house in Hartford, a young Polish girl who is said to have been shipped from New York to the Hartford house, and two other persons were arrested by the government agents there and were brought to the city that night.

The prisoners arrested here, who are accused of trafficking in girls for years, are Morris Cohen, 65 years old, who says he is a teamster, and actually does a small teaming business, and his wife Lena, who is 34 years old. They live on the third floor of the tenement house at 290 Forsyth street. The Hartford woman is Jennie Loretta.

Irvine Mitchell, division superintendent of the department of justice, and George C. Craft, the assistant superintendent, who had charge of actual dealing in white slaves had come to the attention of the government agents throughout the country to other cities to watch for new arrivals in the disorderly houses there and find out where they came from.
