SAYS GARAGE MATTER IS UP TO INSPECTOR

Matter of Erection on Site of
Princess Street Fire Be-
fore Council

EXPRESS REGRET AT
DEATH OF FIRE CHIEF

Members of Board Are
Named to Accompany
Ottawa Delegation.

The class of buildings that should be allowed in Princess street, where the recent fire occurred, and the sending of delegates to Ottawa with the all-Canada delegation, were among the matters discussed at the meeting of the Common Council yesterday afternoon. A resolution of sympathy was ordered sent to the family of C. H. Jackson, late acting chief of the fire department. On motion of Commissioner Harding a lease of the rooms in the Market building, formerly occupied by the Ken- neth Club, was ordered issued to the Hi-bernian Club for one year from May 1 next at \$80 per year.

A New Garage.

Commissioner Harding said he had received a sketch plan of a garage which G. A. Cameron proposed to erect in Princess street, in the district recently fire swept, and he was wondering whether a permit should be granted in view of the fact that a petition was coming to the council protesting against the erection of any garage in this location. It was pointed out by Mayor Potts that so long as the building met the requirements of the building law the matter was up to the building inspector. No action was taken. Commissioner Harding referred to the death of C. H. Jackson, acting chief of the fire department, and after voicing his regret at the loss sustained by the city and the safety department, moved that a letter of sympathy be forwarded to the widow of Mr. Jackson. This carried unanimously.

A communication from the Union of Canadian Municipalities asking that the City Council endorse a resolution of the London, Ont., City Council asking that municipalities be exempt from the stamp tax law, was referred to the Mayor and city solicitor.

Bill for Engineer.

A bill of \$795.67 from the New Brunswick Board of Public Utilities for the expenses of Professor Baird and work done by stenographer in making copies of report, was referred to the Mayor and city solicitor.

On motion of Commissioner Bullock, the members of the council were appointed delegates from the city to accompany the all-Canada delegation to Ottawa.

Mayor Potts reported to the council that he believed the mission of the delegates to Montreal and Ottawa seeking additional facilities at this port had been a success and had paved the way for the larger delegation to go next week.

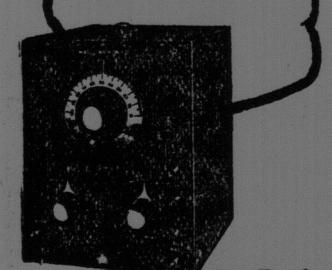

FINDS ALCOHOL IS CAUSE OF DEATH

Gloucester Jury Urges Tighten-
ing up of Dry Law En-
forcement.

GLoucester, N. S., Feb. 20.—That Daniel Lynk came to his death on Feb. 5, 1925, from an overdose of alcoholic liquors, consumed at the Kioto Cafe, during the hockey club banquet, and we recommend better enforcement of the Nova Scotia Temperance Act in the Town of Gloucester, was the decision reached by the coroner's jury, which conducted an inquest on the body of Daniel Lynk.

Blames Alcohol.

The analysis of the stomach showed, according to Dr. A. G. Nicholls, provincial pathologist, no signs of the presence of poison. Alcohol was detected but it did not contain any poisonous properties.

Dr. McNeil stated that when he performed the post mortem, he found the organs of the body in a normal state. The doctor said that he was of the opinion an overdose of alcohol was the reason.

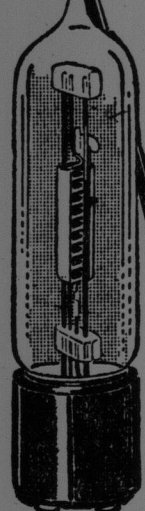

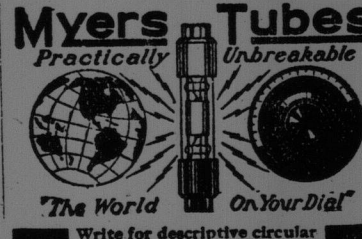

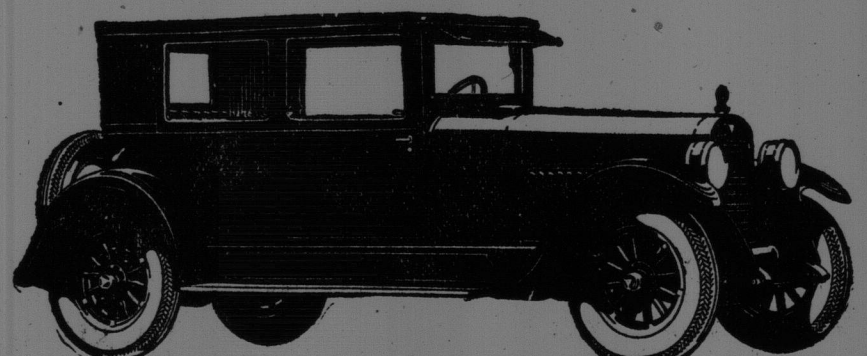
