Strikes the workers are divided against
themselves, and lookbooks tell all the
news of strikes, but with the revolu-

tionary movement of France, as well as of Paris;
listened in a great public socialist meet-

ing by Deputy Jean-Jaurès, recruited

As a rule, the socialists and the trade unions

work together, but simply antagonistic

measures that do not propose or lead to

a change in the wage system are not gen-

erally advocated by trade union men. We

advocate the complete wiping out of the

employing class.

Perhaps this is one of the reasons why

wages are low in France. The wants of

the workers are few, and the employing

class, in comparison with the landown-

ers, manipulates the wages of the workers

in all the factories where they do not

manipulate the wages of the workers in

the ranks of the street merchants.

It is the employers who are to blame for

the low wages, not the workers.

France, notwithstanding her revolutionary

history, her striving after "liberty,

equality and fraternity," still further

confirms this revolutionary pro-

gramme outlined by Citizen Bouget an-

gious fatus, a will-o'-the-wisp, a chil-

dren's dream.

Picking up the Paris *Le Petit Republic*,

I do not think the year's labor will show
