The men were George Easler and Albert Downey, two of the best known fishermen sailing from Gloucester.

**HARD TO BEAT.**

Halifax Herald—Captain Charles McBride, of Waterville, one of Nova Scotia's best known master mariners, in command of the Windsor schooner W. H. Baxter, arrived at Halifax from New York on the 2nd instant, discharged 425 tons coal, towed to Bridgewater, loaded 454,000 feet of lumber, shipped by the Davison Lumber Co., L. L., and sailed for Havana, Cuba, on Saturday 16th. During the time in Bridgewater, three days, without weathering being unfavourable for taking in cargo.
