TENNIS TEAM  
FROM STATES  
WON THE CUP

Wimbledon, Eng., July 28.—The United States team today recaptured the Dwight F. Davis international lawn tennis cup from England by adding a victory by Maurice E. McLaughlin over C. P. Dixon in the singles matches, double match already won and thus gaining the three matches out of the series of five necessary to carry off the cup.

Intense interest was shown in the deciding matches today in the challenge round of the contest between England and the United States for possession of the Dwight F. Davis international lawn tennis trophy in which the United States team has already placed two wins to its credit while the English team have scored only one victory.

Only one further success out of the two singles matches still remaining of the series of five matches was necessary for the American players to capture the coveted trophy from the English holders and the closeness of the contest attracted a great crowd of lawn tennis enthusiasts to the famous courts of the all-England Lawn Tennis Association.

Summer skies and a high temperature greeted the players when they appeared on the ground. Maurice E. McLaughlin, of San Francisco, who was beaten on Friday by J. C. Parks, has been drawn to meet C. P. Dixon, the veteran English player, while R. Norris Williams of Philadelphia, who had on Friday defeated Dixon, was pitted against Parks.

Dixon before play started said: "The English team has had bad luck thus far, but I expect to go after McLaughlin head-on today."

McLaughlin won the first set in his match against Dixon by 8 games to 6.

McLaughlin won the second set from Dixon by 6 games to 3.

The United States team today won the Davis Lawn Tennis Cup.

McLaughlin won the third set from Dixon by 6 games to 2, and thus carried off the match in three straight sets, 8-6, 6-3, 6-2.
