### WORTH KNOWING.

#### Another Biscuit Trick

Perhaps all housewives do not know that biscuits for tea may be made directly after dinner. Place in this ready to bake and stand. They are very nice and light, and if one has company to tea and does not want to mix biscuit, it will be found a decided improvement on the old way.

#### Mud Spots

#### To Save Work if Dresses Shrink

In making wash dresses which are apt to shrink, always allow deep enough hem for a two-inch tuck, to be run in by hand on the under side. After being laundered, should they shrink, it is an easy matter to lengthen.

#### Powdered Sugar for Ice Cream

When using boiled custard for ice cream, you will find it much smoother if made with powdered sugar and a little flour in place of granulated sugar. In this way it tastes more like it made with pure cream after being frozen.

#### For the Camper's Napkins

Stout matla envelopes with the owner's name on the front make good napkin-holders for between meals, particularly where there are a number of persons to be kept separate, as on camping trips, informal house parties, etc. We have also used cotinapines (the ones with a spring) for our camp napkins; the name being printed on the flat side of the pin.

#### To Cut Cheese

To cut Neufchatel or other soft cheese in smooth slices for serving, use a stout thread instead of a knife, as there will be no crumbling or breaking of the slices. I learned this from a professional demonstrator.

#### Rings for White Shades

Get small screw-eyes, open the eye wide enough to insert a large-sized ivory ring, the ring together with pinners. With a small brush enamel the screw-eyes with white paint and you have an attractive and serviceable ring for your white shades. These do not soil like the crochet rings, and if soiled are easily cleaned with a damp cloth.

#### An Original Filling for Cake

A most delicious and beautiful filling for cake can be made by using the surplus syrup from preserves, cooking it until it forms a soft ball in cold water, then pouring it over the whites of eggs which have been beaten to a stiff froth.

#### A New Use for Ugly Pictures

In many houses there are pictures well faded and strongly framed, which cannot be sold or given away. If you have such a picture, substitute a pretty piece of chintz for the picture under the glass, get a pair of ladies (brass) at the hardware store and screw them on both ends. Glue a piece of felt to the back and you have a nice tray.

### Dried-Apple Jam for Sandwiches

A stiff rich jam is made by cooking down the apple-pulp with cider, or tart plums (or other fruit). Put into molds to harden and spread on slices for sandwiches or cake-filling.

### Whole Baked Dried Apples

The peeled, whole apples may be baked in dried form. After soaking at least six hours place in a baking-dish; fill centers with butter and sugar or some tart jelly. Add just enough water to prevent burning; cover and bake. When done, remove cover and brown lightly. (The dried apples bake brown lightly.) (The dried apples bake brown lightly.)

### German Dried-Apple Pie

Wash, soak and simmer some whole dried apples in sirup. Add to the sirup a teaspoonful of butter, a pinch of salt and a generous sprinkling of cinnamon. When tender, place carefully in a lightly baked under crust; sprinkle again with cinnamon and cover with a meringue made of egg whites and sugar. Bake in a moderate oven.

### Italian Dried Apple Pie

Prepare the apples as in the foregoing recipe, omitting the cinnamon. When the cooked whole apples are carefully placed in a baked crust, fill the centers with orange marmalade; add a sprinkling of chopped citron, then pour over them the sirup in which they were cooked, flavored with vanilla. Lay lattice strips of pastry across the top and bake.

### French Dried-Apple Pie

This may be made with the pulp left from jelly or with leftover apple slices. Heat the sweetened well, and for each pie add a tablespoonful of butter and the grated rind of a lemon. Cook fast eight minutes, then add the full cupful of chopped marmalade. Stir in a baked crust. Lay a lattice of pie paste over the top and brown lightly.

### Dried-Apple Cream

Make a rich apple sauce and flavor with cinnamon. Strain into a bag; add a pinch of salt and sugar. When cold, serve with custard or cream.

### Dried-Apple Filling for Cake

Cook down a richly sweetened apple sauce until very thick. For one cupful allow the white of one egg and a pinch of salt. Beat the egg whites in the latter before removing from the fire, then pour the hot apple on the stiff-whipped white of an egg, stirring all the while. Spread at once.

### Dried-Apple-Sauce Cake

Cream together one-half cupful each of sugar and butter, add one egg, three tablespoonfuls of molasses, three-fourths of a pint of thick apple sauce, with spice to taste and two cups of flour. Have ready one cupful of seeded, floured, cooked raisins. Stir these into the mixture, and just before pouring into the cake-pan, stir in thoroughly two level teaspoonfuls of soda dissolved in two teaspoonfuls of hot water.

### Cider Sugar

Heat one pint of sweet cider; add two pounds of sugar and boil till it is a thick syrup. Pour it out on buttered saucers by the tablespoonful, and twist each spoonful into little sticks.
