## RETURNED MEN HERE YESTERDAY

## Steamer Corsican Arrived in Morning via Newfoundland—Brought 330 Passengers Here.

The S.S. Corsican docked a little after nine o'clock yesterday morning but it was after ten o'clock before any one was allowed on board, and there were five invalids suffering from influenza who had to be removed to the Immigration Hospital, Partridge Island.

The vessel, which was 12 days out of Liverpool, called at St. John's, Newfoundland, where she landed over 400 passengers and brought about 300 passengers to this port, consisting of officers travelling under their own expense and civilians.

On the morning of her return to St. John's, Newfoundland, on board the Corsican, was Private Thomas Rick, the winner of the Victoria Cross, Croix de Guerre and the D. C. M. Private Rick's native home is at Middle Arm, White Bay, Newfoundland, a little village of five families. He was awarded the coveted decoration for distinguished conduct under heavy fire during an advance from Loughesham, when the British army was temporarily held up by heavy hostile fire. He volunteered to go forward with his section commander and a Lewis machine gun to teach the enemy machine gunners their lesson.
