MAINE ANXIOUS ABOUT POTATO DISEASES

State Expert Tells How Powdery Scab May be Stamped Out—Says if New Brunswick Growers Follow the Right Course the American Embargo Will be Lifted in Three or Four Years—How the Aroostook Farmers Co-operate With Great Profit to Themselves.

Bangor, Me., Jan. 30.—That it will be at least three or four years, and probably a great deal longer before New Brunswick potatoes, now barred from Maine under the embargo, will be allowed to enter is the opinion of C. E. Embree, of this city, the director of the bureau of marketing and supplies of the state agricultural department.

"If the people of New Brunswick, who are raising potatoes, drop their present fields, take new lands, fumigate their seed with formaldehyde and use the most drastic measures in their control, it is possible that the powdery scab, and the black rot which is present in the province, can be eliminated in three or four years," says Mr. Embree.

"The Farmers' Union Grain and Supply Company, controlled by the farmers, is now handling grain, feed, fertilizer, poisons, and farm machinery and other articles will be added later. From this source the local exchanges all over the state are supplied on the co-operative plan. Figuring on the present transactions the gross business for the first year will be about \$100,000 and it is estimated that in three years it will amount to \$3,000,000. A great saving will be effected for the farmers."

"Powdery scab," said he, "is now found in a few places in Maine, but it is not so common as it is in Canada, and it is not so serious. Our Canadian neighbors should be encouraged to clean up, but until they do so, we must not export our line either openly or surreptitiously."

He urged on the Maine growers the importance of pure seed stock, and talked at length on the need for improvement. He recommended the adoption by the state of a system of inspection for the potato sections by trained inspectors attached to the state department of agriculture, and an effort is to be made to have the plan put into effect in this state.

IDEAL FOOD FOR LAYING HENS. Prof. Rice, of Cornell, holds that the fowls should eat about one-half as much mash by weight as whole grain. Regarding the proportion of grain and ground feed in the morning and about all they will consume at the afternoon feeding, in time of pull or fowls in heavy laying restrict both night and morning feedings to induce heavy eating of dry mash, especially in the case of hens. This ration should be supplemented with beta, calcium, sprouted oats, green clover or other succulent food. Grain crushed in a shell and charcoal should be accessible at all times. Green food should not be fed in a frozen condition. All feed and litter should be strictly sanitary, clean and free from dirt, mold or decay.
