As no Urder in Council has bet passed for regulating the procedure of the Uustom; in collecting the difference of duty in the cases mentioned, I have to request you carefully to examinne such dutable goods as may be brought to your port from the Island, and to inform yourself of the actual rate of duty paid thereon, and collect the difference between the rate so paid, and the rate per Dominion Tariff, and upon the face of each entry, to show the full original value of the goods, the rate and amount of duty paid, the rate and amount of duty paid, the rate and amount of duty paid, the rate and amount of duty under the Dominion Tariff, and the difference between the second and all such transactions are to be accounted for in your statistical books and returns, separate from the general specifications of imports.
