Railway Mail Service presents some interesting features respecting the working of the Post Office Department of the United States. 3,852,629 pounds of mail matter "originate" in New York City monthly. Of this a large proportion, as we might expect, consists of second-class matter, or publications issued at stated intervals and sent to regular subscribers. 82.82 per cent, or 2,768,502 pounds of newspapers and periodicals pass through the New York offices each month. Only 7.8 per cent consists of first-class matter, on which the postage is at the rate of one cent per two ounces makes 9,12 per cent. Samples of merchandize are frequently complained of as overloading the mails; but these statistics shew that they only make 9.20 of 1 per cent of the whole amonnt. The yoar 1874 shews a large increase over former years in the bulk of the mails.
