

they may be intended, only at the time of raising and fixing the same; and every carpenter or undertaker offending herein, shall incur a penalty of twenty shillings, and pay five shillings for each day that he shall continue so offending, after being prosecuted; and the same penalty shall attach upon every proprietor or occupier of lots of ground, permitting or suffering any such work to be done contrary to this Regulation, opposite to the lots by them respectively owned or occupied.

ART. 6. All proprietors of houses, in the City and Suburbs, shall keep their chimnies in good repair, under the penalty of forty shillings; and all vents of chimnies, in the City and Suburbs, shall be left free and open at the top and bottom, in such manner as shall admit of the same being conveniently swept, under the penalty of twenty shillings. Every stove pipe shall pass into a chimney under the penalty of twenty shillings; and no person shall have more than two stove pipes introduced in any chimney, in each story, under the penalty of ten shillings for each offence. And whenever the Inspector of Chimnies shall have certified that any chimney or wall is dangerous, either on account of fire or to passengers, or that any vent of a chimney is obstructed, so as to prevent the same from being so swept, and upon such certificate, two Justices
