A Message was brought from the House of Commons, to return the Bill intituled a "An Act further to amend 'The Consolidated Railway Act, 1879,' and to declare. "certain lines of Railway to be works for the general advantage of Canada," and to acquaint this House that they have agreed to the amendments made by the Senate to the said Bill without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, with a Bill intituled: "An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for "defraying certain expenses of the Public Service, for the financial years ending "respectively the 30th June, 1883, and the 30th June, 1884, and for other purposes "relating to the Public Service," to which they desire the concurrence of this House.

The said Bill was read for the first time.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons, and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

The House was adjourned during pleasure.
