Teacher pact OK'd

The three-year agreement negotiated with elementary school teachers has been ratified by the Peel Board of Education

The board reviewed and adopted the proposed agreement in public session last week

Chief board negotiator Fawn Currey said the three-year pact, the longest ever for elementary teachers, would allow both instructors and the board to concentrate on educational problems.

Teachers will meet in September to discuss and vote on the agreement. Bob Sinclair of the Peel Educators' Association says teachers will be looking for some action on proposed study committees before a final vote is taken. Committees to study staffing, transfer and surplus procedures, grievances and a deferred salary leave plan have been agreed to.
