report. He gave the report and sent it for my benefit. In reply, I stated that I did not consider 16 persons to the acre of ground an overcrowded condition, that for the last 100 years they never grew vegetables or owned a horse or a cow at Rocky Point. The Department has provided two water closets, but does not own the Spring where they get their water. I enclose that report to the Dept. The Superintendent of Education wrote me asking me to make provision for the education of the children there as they won't be admitted to the white school, I don't know what to do. If I fail in my duty there it won't be for lack of free advice.
