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And upon such Terms as the Legislators shall think most Proper; It would not only Prove a benefit to the Province in gen<sup>l</sup> but even of great Ease to those who now have the Manag<sup>t</sup> thereof

Since w<sup>ch</sup> we have rec<sup>d</sup> no Intelligence from Canada — Inclosed your Excellency has a Memorall (Setting forth as we are of Opinion) an easier method for supplying the Garrison at Oswego w<sup>th</sup> Provisions than formerly which upon your Excellency's recommendation we hope will take Effect

We also Inclosed send your Excellency a List of Further acc<sup>ts</sup> w<sup>th</sup> their Vouchers which we begg your Excellency will be Pleas'd to Lay before the Assembly, in order upon their perusal to have them discharged w<sup>th</sup> the former having no more to add

Since our last of yesterday's date Lawrence Claesen is returned from his Journey to Onondago, who informs us that upon all his Inspection among the Indians, he can learn no more relating the Intentions of the French than what your Excellency has already received from us

His acc<sup>t</sup> of the Indians to the Southwards is that they do Only Expect some Sackings of that Nation ab<sup>t</sup> the middle of July in order to renew their old Covenant w<sup>th</sup> the Five Nations

A Meeting of the Comm<sup>rs</sup> of Indian Affairs in Albany the 29<sup>th</sup> May 1729

A Proposition with Five of the Principall Sachims of the Castle called Onnah in the Mohawk

Who Produced a large belt of black Wampum, w<sup>ch</sup> were given to them by this Govern<sup>mt</sup> many years past as a Token to confirm the Covenant Chain, which they still stand to, and hope that we do the same

They desire that they may have a Gun with this next Winter in their Castle, and that they may be rode up to Schinectady whereupon they Lay down 3 Deer skins

They also Produce a Dollar w<sup>ch</sup> they say was sent to them for a Token to acquaint them that his late Majesty King George the First is dead, and also that his Present Majesty King George the Second is crowned in his room and Head, for which they desire some Other Token
